CCOC Governance Updates

A new provincial law means CCOC needs to update our bylaws before November 2024. The Board of Directors has created a Governance Committee to lead this work. Membership in the committee includes Board members and department Directors.

With governance and leadership roles evolving across the organization, the Board has also dissolved the Personnel Committee. The Personnel Committee was created in the early 1980s when CCOC was much smaller and there was no HR function on the team. We now have a department responsible for supporting CCOC employees and it is time to phase out the personnel committee. Thank you to all the volunteers and employees who were part of this committee over the past 40 years!

Mental health crisis response pilot

The City of Ottawa has announced a new non-police response to mental health and substance use calls. This evidence-based and compassionate approach will connect people with community health and social service resources while also de-escalating conflict. The pilot will begin in Centretown in 2024 and will include a 24/7, non 911 number to intake, triage and dispatch calls for mental health and substance use crisis support and services.

The initiative is the result of a community-driven approach led by the Guiding Council for Mental Health and Addictions whose work was grounded in research evidence, leading practices, and Ottawa residents' perspectives. This included surveys and a series of focus groups, including two with CCOC tenants last fall. We are grateful to those who shared their personal experiences to inform this work and for the advocacy of the community to improve crises response services.

We know many in our community are struggling with the impact of the overdose, mental health and homelessness crisis, and we are hopeful this will be a step forward to providing more compassionate care.

Summer Camp Bursary

Irving Greenberg was CCOC's first president and a champion of social housing in Ottawa. Following his death in 1991, his family generously made a donation to make camp more affordable for CCOC kids. Each year, the Irving Greenberg Memorial Camp Fund provides camp bursaries for young CCOC tenants.

To participate, you must be a CCOC tenant, and your child (or children) must be 5 to 15 years old. If your child is selected, you are responsible for finding a camp that suits you and your child. The Camp Fund can be used for either March break camp or summer camp, including day or overnight programs. The Irving Greenberg Memorial Camp Fund will cover one week of camp, up to \$400.00 per camper.

Snowsuit Fund

The Snowsuit Fund is an Ottawa-based charity that raises funds to buy and distribute snowsuits to children 15 years and under. If you qualify for the program, you can buy a new snowsuit for your child or children for \$10

each (cash or debit card only). To get a snowsuit, or for more information, call 613-746-8719.

To apply, make sure you have the information listed below to provide proof of your income.

All Clients

A piece of identification indicating the child's date of birth is required for all qualifying children. Identification showing the family's address must also be provided.

If you are receiving **Ontario Works or ODSP**

Please bring your Ontario Works or your drug card.

If you earn low income

Bring your Child Tax Benefit or GST notice from 2022. This notice shows that year's net current or past month's family income, your marital status, and lists your children Statement of Assistance by name and their month and year of birth.

If you are a new arrival to Canada

Provide your date of arrival with RAP form/start-up allowance OR drug card (if applicable).
